The children in the Baby Room have been busy collecting Autumnal resources for their display. They have explored conkers and pine cones, and used them in the paint to create lovely pictures to take home. The children have also been using their fine motor skills to make new sensory bottles, carefully putting items into the bottles with control. Continuing the Autumnal theme, the children have loved posting pine cones through the tubes – posting is always a firm favourite! Out of the window, the children have been observing the birds, excitedly feeding them and pointing them out to each other.

Tweenie Room

The children enjoyed exploring the local natural environment, collecting sticks, pine cones and a variety of leaves. Following in from this, the children participated in a range of activities, including a circles time to investigate all the natural resources collected. They have loved leaf printing, orange drying and discussing what they observe during the change in seasons.

Home learning - it would be wonderful if all Tweenie children could collect any conkers or other natural resources on their own nature walk and bring them to nursery for the children to explore together. Tweenie staff will send home a paper bag for you to collect them in. Thank you!

Going forward, the Tweenies will be practising routines more independently, for example, putting on their own coats, clearing lunch plates away, peeling their own fruit and recognising their own belongings. In addition to this, the children will be exploring pumpkin play and learning about Harvest.

Please see the information below that we have been asked to share from the Local Authority regarding measles.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in an early years setting can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Please share these resources with colleagues, parents, and where suitable, community organisations to increase awareness and encourage parents to get their children vaccinated.

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. We are asking you to share key messages from the NHS about measles / MMR and how to get vaccinated.
