#### Ideas to try at home:

Each school will have their own phonic scheme, so this way the children won't get too confused when moving up to top school. YouTube have a brilliant video that we will be using that goes through each letter and the sound that it makes. If we could use the letter sounds rather than letter names that would be brilliant. Just watching the videos and heaving these sounds will be brilliant in getting your child used to hearing and using them.
